 scientific knowledge to try to eliminate sickness and disease.
 - A Hindu might respond with the second point. For example, maybe in your
 previous life you were healthy and did not care about the suffering of others, so
 now the consequence is that you must be sick in this life.
 - Some might answer the last point: God simply will not or cannot control what ultimately happens to us. Although God might feel bad that we suffer, there is nothing He can do about it other than sympathize and help us get through it as best we can.
